Property Acquisition & Residential Relocation

Mobile homes

- Acquired and relocated the residents at:
 - Burien Gardens, Burien, 74 units
 - Flora Vista, Burien, 28 units
 - Upwardly Mobile, SeaTac, 11 units
 - Tyee Valley, SeaTac, 46 units
- In progress: Town & Country, SeaTac, 200 units

Other

- Acquired 1,400 single-family-home parcels and relocated the residents, including 388 homes for third runway construction
- Acquiring approximately 70 homes in Burien that are in the identified Approach Transition Zone for the new third runway
- Provided sales assistance for 16 homeowners in the noisiest areas

Noise Remedy (sound insulation)

Single-family homes insulated

- Completed over 9,300 within the original 1985 noise boundaries
- Completed nearly 90 that were projected to be affected by the airport's new runway

Other

- Insulated three private schools, two churches, one convalescent center and one condominium complex
- Insulating 22 Highline Community College buildings

Condominiums

- Sound insulated the following:
 - Rainier House, unincorporated King County, 24 units
 - Seawind, Des Moines, 120 units
 - Emerald green, unincorporated King County, 32 units
 - Hill Sites 1 & 2, Des Moines, 16 units
 - Pinebrook, Des Moines, 44 units

Highline School District

- Spent \$44.5 million to-date from a total of \$115 million in Port of Seattle and Federal Aviation Administrative funds on sound insulation and related improvements. 6 of the 15 schools identified to receive funds are complete and 1 more is in progress.
- Other to-date Port contributions:
 - \$3.9 million to Aviation High School
 - \$75,000 to the District's apprenticeship program
