Fund Class Definitions

Bond Fund: Bond Funds are invested primarily in bonds and other debt instruments. The exact type of debt the fund invests in will depend on its focus, but investments may include government, corporate, municipal, and convertible bonds, along with other debt securities like mortgage-backed securities. Bond Funds typically pay periodic dividends that include interest payments on the fund's underlying securities plus periodic realized capital appreciation. Funds invest in different maturities of bonds. This may be described by terms like "short," "intermediate," and "long." This affects how the fund value changes with interest rates.

Blend funds: A category of equity mutual funds with portfolios that are made up of a mix of value and growth stocks.

Large Cap Stock Fund (Domestic): "Large Cap" refers to companies with a market capitalization value of more than \$8-10 billion. Large Cap is an abbreviation of the term "large market capitalization." Stock Funds invest in equities more commonly known as stocks. Domestic Stock Funds can invest only in US companies.

Large Cap Stock Fund (International): "Large Cap" refers to companies with a market capitalization value of more than \$8-10 billion. Large Cap is an abbreviation of the term "large market capitalization." Stock Funds invest in equities more commonly known as stocks. International Stock Funds can invest in companies located anywhere outside of its investors' country of residence.

Growth Fund: A diversified portfolio of stocks that has capital appreciation as its primary goal, with little or no dividend payouts. Portfolio companies would mainly consist of companies with above-average growth in earnings that reinvest their earnings into expansion, acquisitions, and/or research and development.

Value Fund: A stock mutual fund that primarily holds stocks that are deemed to be undervalued in price and that are likely to pay dividends. Value funds are one of three main mutual fund types; the other two are growth and blend (a mix of value and growth stocks) funds.

Small and Mid-Cap Stock Fund: "Mid Cap" refers to companies with a market capitalization between \$2 and \$10 billion, which is calculated by multiplying the number of a company's shares outstanding by its stock price. "Small Cap" refers to companies with a relatively small market capitalization. Stock Funds invest in equities more commonly known as stocks.

Index Fund: An index fund is designed to track the performance of a market index. The fund may be a mutual fund or an exchange traded fund (ETF) which trades on an exchange like a stock. The index being tracked may represent a group of stocks, a commodity or any tradable entity such as real estate.

Expense Ratio: A calculation of costs an investment company to operate a mutual fund. An expense ratio is determined annually through a calculation, where a fund's operating expenses are divided by the average dollar value of its assets under management. Operating expenses are taken out of a fund's assets and lower the return to a fund's investors.
