RESOLUTION NO. 3535

A RESOLUTION of the Port Commission of the Port of Seattle declaring certain real property surplus (6010 S. River Street) and no longer needed for Port District purposes and authorizing its conveyance to the State Board of Community and Technical Colleges, an Agency of the State of Washington on behalf of South Seattle Community College.

WHEREAS, the voters of King County, pursuant to the provisions of enabling legislation adopted by the Legislature of the State of Washington, Chapter 92, Laws of 1911, RCW 53.04.010, authorized and approved at a special election held in King County on the 5th day of September 1911, the formation of a port district coextensive with King County to be known as the Port of Seattle ("Port"); and

WHEREAS, the Port was thereupon established as a port district and municipal corporation of the State of Washington; and

WHEREAS, the real property known as 6010 S. River Street w. onveyed to the Port when the Port assumed all assets of the Commercial W terway District No. 1 in 1962, and due to its isolated and land locked location has not be a use a for Port operations, and

WHERE S. pursuant to Chapter 39.33 RCW, an official public hearing was held February 22, 2005, after notice of such hearing was duly published as provided by law, the question as to whether said property should be declared surplus to Port needs and transferred to the State Board of Community and Technical Colleges, an Agency of the State of Washington on behalf of South Seattle Community College ("South Seattle Community College"); and

WHEREAS, the maps and other data regarding the property proposed for transfer to South Seattle Community College is on file at the Port offices; and WHEREAS, the Port of Seattle Commission has heard from all persons desiring to speak at said public hearing with regard to the proposed transfer of property to South Seattle Community College; and

WHEREAS, the members of the Port of Seattle Commission have discussed and considered the proposed surplus and transfer of said property to South Seattle Community College in light of all comments by members of the public at the public hearing;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Port Commission of the Port of Seattle as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. The real property legally described below, ("Property"), is hereby declared surplus to Port needs and no longer needed for Port purposes. The Property has a market value of \$65,100.
