

# Local high school students present environmental solutions in airport challenge



A group of Raisbeck Aviation High School students recently presented their winning design from the 12<sup>th</sup> annual Airports and the Environment Project Challenge to Port of Seattle employees. Each year, Raisbeck Aviation High School sophomores participate in the challenge created by Highline teachers and Port staff, designed to teach students about the environmental aspects of aviation and increase interest in aviation careers. Students break into consulting teams and are tasked with solving a "true-to-life" environmental problem representative of the type of challenges airports typically encounter.

This year, students were tasked with creating a strategy to modernize the South Satellite that met several specifications. The design was required to minimize energy and water use, give passengers a Northwest 'sense-of-place,' satisfy the airlines' demands, provide greater revenue potential for the airport and meet the Port's financial objectives.

Abdi Mohamedhaji, Joseph Nwizugbo, Alexis Sorm, Matiyas Yared and Kevin Nguyen, who developed the winning challenge, presented three proposals designed to conserve water: replace water fountains with water-bottle fillers, implement a greywater capture and reuse system, and renovate the airport's old water pipes to reduce leaks.

## Airport shuttle makes travel a little more green





When John Solin first saw a need for a convenient transportation option between Whidbey Island and Sea-Tac Airport he looked to the skies. Solin, a civilian pilot, had a plan to start his own airline to get people to from Whidbey Island to Sea-Tac Airport more easily; when that fell through, Solin started exploring other options. In 2003, Solin and business partner Mike Lauver started a shuttle service between Whidbey Island and Sea-Tac Airport to provide an efficient and cost-effective way for Whidbey Island residents to get to the airport.

In an effort to reduce carbon emissions, Solin started working with Blue Star Gas, a propane fuel distribution company, to begin the process of converting his shuttle fleet from gasoline to propane fuel. By converting nine of its 15 passenger buses from gasoline to propane fuel, Whidbey-Sea-Tac Shuttle reduced carbon emissions by 164 tonnes in 2018. Whidbey Sea-Tac Shuttle's propane-powered buses used 52,969 gallons to travel 350,000 miles shuttling passengers to and from the airport. Due to these efforts, Whidbey-Sea-Tac Shuttle was awarded a 2018 Port of Seattle Environmental Excellence Award in the Small Business — Environmental Performance category.
