Port clean energy projects help establish a greener waterfront



The Port of Seattle was the first home port in North America to offer shore power at two Seattle cruise berths and we haven't stopped there. The Port is working on a plan that will bring shore power to major facilities on the working waterfront, using an underwater cable to eventually connect all shore power-capable cruise ships at four cruise vessel berths in Seattle.

The power supply to this submarine cable is envisioned to connect to the city grid at the same location as the proposed shorepower service for Terminal 46; this will establish shorepower connectivity for shore power capable cruise ships at all four cruise vessel berths in Seattle once the two projects are complete. The efforts are part of the Port's goal to be the greenest, most energy efficient Port in North America.

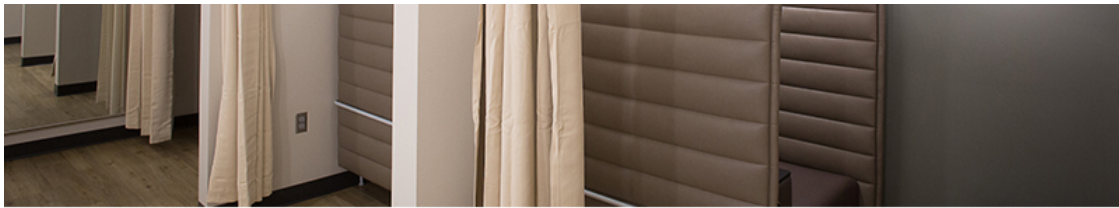

Traveling moms can now enjoy a **brand-new nursing suite** located on the upper-level mezzanine of the North Satellite at SEA. It has a spa-inspired design and high-end finishes, three curtained alcoves for privacy, a lounge with comfy seating, stroller storage, charging stations, a restroom, multiple sinks, and ample counter space.

The North Satellite mother's room is part of the airport's North Satellite Modernization Project, which expands and renovates the 45-year-old facility. The first phase of the new facility opened in July, and the project is expected to be completed next spring

Local high school students present environmental solutions in airport challenge



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This year, students were tasked with creating a strategy to modernize the South Satellite that met several specifications. The design was required to minimize energy and water use, give passengers a Northwest ‘sense-of-place,’ satisfy the airlines’ demands, provide greater revenue potential for the airport and meet the Port’s financial objectives.

Abdi Mohamedhaji, Joseph Nwizugbo, Alexis Sorm, Matiyas Yared and Kevin Nguyen, who developed the winning challenge, presented three proposals designed to conserve water: replace water fountains with water-bottle fillers, implement a greywater capture and reuse system, and renovate the airport’s old water pipes to reduce leaks.
