RESOLUTION NO. 3213

A RESOLUTION of the Port Commission of the Port of Seattle to promote health and safety in Port workplaces.

WHEREAS, Chapter 296-24 WAC requires management to establish and maintain a safe and healthful working environment; and

WHEREAS, observations of effective organizations and a growing body of studies on organizational effectiveness indicate that organizations with explicit top level leadership and support have a lower rate of accidents, injuries, worker days lost and claims;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is resolved by the Port Commission of the Port of Seattle that:

1. All Port of Seattle workplaces should be healthful and safe.

2. Establishing and maintaining healthful and safe workplaces will be an integral part of the Port's mission.

3. Every Port director, manager and supervisor is expected to recognize health and safety as good business, provide needed support and resources to health and safety programs and activities, and demonstrate by his/her own behavior, decisions and actions a strong commitment to health and safety.

4. Every Port employee is expected to demonstrate a positive attitude toward accident prevention, and follow safe and healthy work practices; and

5. Every Port employee is expected to make every effort to achieve the following health safety goals:

-No accidents or injuries at the workplace

-No workdays lost as a result of accidents or injuries

-No claims from accidents and injuries

-No safety or health-related regulatory citations or fines.
