

RESOLUTION NO. 2686

A RESOLUTION of the Port Commission of the Port of Seattle disclaiming any interest in securing the maintenance for future public docksites by King County of the property which is the subject of King County Cause No. 808694, and authorizing its attorneys to move for dismissal of the Port of Seattle from said action and to desist from defending therein.


WHEREAS, the Port of Seattle, on March 9, 1976, was served with a summons and complaint in Cause No. 808694 in the Superior Court of the State of Washington for King County, entitled "King County, a political subdivision of the State of Washington vs. The Port of Seattle, a municipal corporation, and all persons or parties unknown claiming any right, title, estate, lien or interest in the real property described in the complaint on file herein";

WHEREAS, said action is a suit to quiet title to property in which the Port of Seattle owns no portion of the fee,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Port Commission of the Port of Seattle, Washington, that the Port of Seattle has no interest in its capacity as a port district in securing the County's maintenance for future public docksites of the property which is the subject of Cause No. 808694 in the Superior Court of the State of Washington for King County, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Port of Seattle Commission authorize Bogle & Gates, its attorneys, in Cause No. 808694 in the Superior Court of the State of Washington for King County to move for an order dismissing the Port of Seattle as a defendant and to desist from defending further the Port of Seattle in said action.
