BE IT RESOLVED by the Port Commission of the Port of Seattle, as  
follows:

SECTION 1. The Port of Seattle does hereby establish and adopt  
rules, regulations, and charges shown in:


Seattle Terminals Tariff No. 2-F, F.M.C.-T No. 3

F.M.C.-T No. 3, are hereby repealed.

file said schedule with the Federal Maritime Commission.

TARIFF AMENDMENT DIRECTIVE NO. 64

SECTION 1.
