Today the National Weather Service has issued

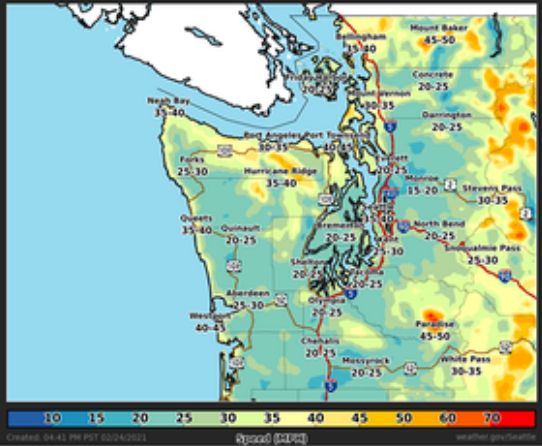
High Winds Forecast From/To: 1030 - 0500L.

Sustained Winds: 10 to 20MPH with Potential

Gusts up to 30MPH

**Ensure breaks are set and all GSE is chocked,
cargo and all other loads are secured, Jet Bridge
Doors are closed, dumpster lids are closed and
secured, etc.**

MAXIMUM WIND GUSTS



1st Round: Tonight – Thursday PM

📍 Strongest Winds

Pacific Coast, San Juan Islands, Admiralty Inlet, and Skagit & Whatcom Counties.

Details:

Winds pick up near Coast tonight & remain elevated through Thursday PM. S winds 25-35 mph, gusts to 45-55 mph possible.

2nd Round: Thursday PM – Friday AM

📍 Strongest Winds

Admiralty Inlet

Details:

Winds shift to W 25-40 mph, gusts to 60 mph possible.
