



**Hazardous Weather and High Winds Forecasted  
for SEA Early Sunday thru Tuesday.**

**SEA Airport will potentially see sustained winds of 25-35 mph with gust of up to 40 mph and a low chance of thunderstorms rolling through western Washington. Heaviest precipitation to occur on Monday through Tuesday.**

This is a reminder to be aware of slick surfaces, potential water pooling, decrease visibility, braking distance and other safety factors that may impact regular routines.

- **Ensure Brakes are Set**
- **All GSE is Chocked**
- **All Loads are Secured (ULDs, Carts etc.)**
- **Jet Bridge Doors are Closed**
- **Dumpster Lids are Shut**


# Wind Gust Scenarios

Area	Low End Max Wind Gusts (9 in 10 chance of gusts this high)	Most Likely	High End Max Wind Gusts (1 in 10 chance of gusts this high)
Coast	45-55 mph	55-65 mph	65-70 mph
Interior Everett and Northward (including Western Whatcom/Skagit, Island and San Juan Counties and Port Townsend area)	35-45 mph	45-60 mph	50-65 mph
Interior South of Everett (including Seattle Metro)	25-35 mph	35-45 mph	45-50 mph
Cascade Gaps (eg. North Bend, Enumclaw, Monroe)	25-35 mph	40-50 mph	45-55 mph
