Port Welcomes First Flight into New IAF at SEA

Port Kicks Off 2022 Cruise Season This Saturday



The Port welcomed the first passenger flight to use the new International Arrivals Facility (IAF) at Seattle-Tacoma International Airport (SEA) this week with the arrival of Delta Air Lines flight 196 from Seoul-Incheon. The flight kicks off the final readiness testing phase of the project. Between now and May 10, the airport will bring a limited number of flights through the new facility to complete orientation and activation.

Commission Adds \$2M to Youth Career Launch Pilot

Port Releases Diversity in Contracting Report



The Port Commission approved another two million dollars in funding for its Youth Career Launch Pilot Program, nearly doubling its resources. This puts total funding for the program, an evolution of the Port's Opportunity Youth Initiative, at \$4.1 million for the next three years. The additional revenue comes directly from the faster-than-expected recovery of the Port's cruise business and directly supports maritime industry jobs.



The Port released its third annual Diversity in Contracting report on its program operations for 2021. The Port of Seattle established a 16 percent Women and Minority Owned Business Enterprise (WMBE) utilization goal for 2021 for its organization divisions and departments. Despite 2021's economic challenges, the Port continued to make great strides surpassing 2020's results in achieving Port-wide WMBE utilization goals for 2021.

RECAP APRIL 12: The Port Commission authorized an order to increase the three-year investment in the Youth Career Launch Program from \$2.1 million to \$4.1 million, and heard a briefing on Sound Transit 3 – West Seattle and Ballard Link Extensions Draft Environmental Impact Statement and Ballard/Interbay Segments. Commissioners also heard a Diversity in Contracting Annual Report, a C Concourse Expansion Project Briefing, and Youth Internship Programs Update. View video→

UP NEXT APRIL 26: The Port Commission will issue a Holocaust Remembrance Day Proclamation, and will hear a Baggage Optimization Program Update – Second Quarter 2022, and a presentation on the Sustainable Century and Fly Quiet Awards.

The Port Commission will also consider authorization of an agreement with the Seattle Aquarium for a project investigating Urban Kelp Forest, and will consider authorizing a cooperative research and development agreement with Pacific Northwest National Labs, Sandia National Labs and Seattle City Light to study risk assessment of large-scale hydrogen storage in a Port environment.
