

What is Public Works Contracting?



Per Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 39.04

- "Public work" means all work, construction, alteration, repair, or improvement other than ordinary maintenance, executed at the cost of the state or of any municipality
- All public works, including maintenance (& off-site pre-fabricated items) when performed by contract shall comply with chapter 39.12 RCW - Prevailing Wage.
- Award is to be made to the Lowest Responsive Bid and Responsible Bidder.
- Contractors must be responsible and keep in mind that prime contractors have a limited time to review bid documents from the advertisement date to the bid due date

What does it mean to be a responsible bidder?

- · Industrial insurance
- · Performance and payment bonds

- Must attend L&I training on Public
 Works and Prevailing Wage Law unless
 a contractor has been in business for 3 or
 more years and has completed 3 or more
 public works projects.
- Certified Payrolls



JOC Overview

- Individual small projects are assigned as Work Orders
- Well-defined, recurring, or repetitive work where quick execution is essential
- Small new construction, renovation and alteration projects that are not typically completed by SW On-Call (one-trade)
- Work Orders = up to \$500,000

We have a small pool of private customers we perform for, but it is very limited. Ninety percent of what we do is either State or Federal work.

- We do require Certified Payrolls, L & I good standing, Certificates of Insurance, a DUNS Number, bonding for larger subcontracts and hazardous waste scopes & Safety and Accident Prevention Plans. We can help with all these items as needed.
- Prospective subcontractors will be issued a Subcontractor Qualification
 Form followed up by onboarding paperwork to complete and return to our local office.
- Once this has been completed, we will reach out for quotes based on our current project load and disciplines needed.
- Once selected for a project we will perform a New Subcontractor Orientation further outlining our requirements.

DBE Program

- What is the Program?
 - Federal program applicable to projects with federal funding
 - Purpose: Ensure DBEs have equal opportunity to compete for contracts, subcontracts, and agreements in the award and administration of contracts.
 - Other agencies with DBE programs
 - WSDOT
 - Sound Transit
- What is a DBE?
 - For-profit small business (<\$30.4M)
 - At least 51% owned by socially and economically disadvantaged individual(s) (personal networth <\$1.32M)
- Who provides certification?
 - Contact the Office of Minority and Women Business Enterprises (OMWBE) to get certified
