Project Overview

Purpose: Provide two Port-furnished, owned, and fully maintained full-service kitchen spaces for Airport, Dining and Retail (ADR) to lease to small business food and beverage operators.

Background:

Implement a program that provides small business operators with shorter and flexible lease term opportunities to test their restaurant concepts in an airport environment to determine viability without significant capital investment.

Estimated Cost: \$2.5M - \$3.5M (total cost of construction)

WMBE Goal (each contract): 15% Aspirational Goal

Project Delivery Method: Design-Bid-Build

Two locations: Concourse B & Central Terminal.



<u>Purpose:</u> Provide space for 4 airfield compactors on the North Side of the airport to service Airplanes on concourses C, D and N.

Consolidate North Airfield Compactors that were displaced by CCE a new location is needed for Safety Concerns at the North Satellite and Environmental Compliance.

Pre-manufactured covered trash compactor structure



- Site utilities, power, communication, water/sewer to the new structure.








Project Overview

Purpose: To preserve and extend the life of the North Employee Parking Lot and support operational requirements.

Background:

The NEPL is a 24/7/365 operation that shuttles airline, tenant, TSA, and service provider personnel to the main terminal of the Seattle-Tacoma International Airport (SEA). At 25 years old, the lot is experiencing failing infrastructure. This project is intended as a renewal and replacement project for this existing facility.

Estimated Cost: \$6M - \$8M (bid range)

WMBE Goal (each contract): TBD

Project Delivery Method: Design-Bid-Build

Contract Award Details

Teams will be evaluated on:

- Low Bid
- Lump Sum Contract
- WMBE Inclusion Plan
- Construction Phased Over 2 Seasons

Project Scope

NEPL project has three phases.

- Phase I is complete and refreshed the interior of three bus shelters.
- Phase II is complete and replaced a failing rockery wall, replaced failing electrical feeders, and updated interior parking lot signage.
- Phase III will conduct pavement remediation and replace failing watermain and storm channel drains.




