






Marina Steps

Project is currently out for bid

If successful, contract to Council late October for a year-end 2025, or early 2026 construction start date



Marina L, M, and N Dock Replacement Project

Currently under construction

Carefully planned phases to minimize disruption to tenants

Over-water construction allowed between August-February due to fish window

Construction to be completed by February, 2026



Veterans Memorial Triangle Park

Project complete!



Redondo Pier Replacement

Project awarded with Construction Bid of \$3.8M

Permits received

Per Council direction, project fully funded with bond proceeds

Steel and material on order with construction mobilization date November, 2025

Public Safety Efforts

Getting People Services (GPS) position to help our most vulnerable populations

Focused on crime reduction through aggressive enforcement of all laws, from traffic enforcement through violent crimes

2024 Crimes in Washington Report shows crime in Des Moines was reduced by 11% compared to 2023, led by reduction in burglary (-44.6%) and auto theft (-46.6%)

A 200% reduction in the enforcement of drug possession in the City



ON THE HORIZON



- City's revenue sources inadequate to keep up with expenditures
 - Must grow new revenue streams
 - Critical to develop aggressive economic development strategy
 - I% property tax cap does not keep up with general inflation
- Critical look at any new expenditures or initiatives
- Service and staffing reductions necessary in shortterm, but will not meet the expectations of the community long-term
