MISSION

The Port removes systemic barriers and enhances the quality of life for structurally excluded communities. We do so by increasing access to living wage jobs in Port-related industries, improving public spaces, and investing in community-led projects.

Executive Summary: Investments

From 2020-2024, the South King County Community Impact Fund procured four funding cycles to contract with community-based non-profit organizations.

Cycles 1-4 committed a total of \$9.25 million:

SKPCF Environmental Improvements Program (EIP)

Through funding and partnerships with community-based organizations, the Environmental Improvements Program drives the Port's investment in projects in cities around the airport to enhance livability, improve green spaces, and restore forests. The SKCIIF **Environmental Grants Program** expands the reach of the successful Airport Community Ecology (ACE) program into more communities that surround SEA.



Program Outcomes: Environmental Program









Who Can Apply?

- Nonprofit 501c3 and 501c6
- Organizations w/o a tax status can be fiscally sponsored by a 501c3 or 501c6 organization/entity.
- Youth and/or athletic organizations are eligible.



How does funding work?

- oThe funding amounts are up to \$20,000 per year. Contracts can be up to three years for a total of \$60,000. Project terms can be 1, 2, or 3 years..
- Organizations or groups can apply once for up to \$60,000 to be paid throughout these years.
- oThe total funding available for Environmental Improvement Program in Cycle V (this year) is \$500,000.
- Funding is on a reimbursement basis
- Projects must be completed within 1 year (extensions possible)



What types of projects can be funded?

- Projects that include a public improvement
- Eligible locations may include: public parks, open spaces, trails, public schools in the eligible geographic areas.
- Projects that meet the 2:1 match requirement per RCW 35.21.278
- Private property projects are not eligible



South King and Port Communities Project Eligibility Area



- Signed Declaration page
- Two (2) Letters of Recommendation, including one from the property owner of the location where the public improvement will take place
- Current IRS letter verifying the nonprofit organization's 501(c)3 or 501(c)6 taxexempt status
- Fiscal Sponsor Letter, if applicable



*Application must be delivered by email to esubmittals-sa@portseattle.org.

- Anticipated Application deadline is Friday, October 31, 2025 by 12:00 PM PDT (NOON).
- Include in the email subject line the application number, application title, and organization name (e.g. Subject: 0032XXXX [Application Name] Cycle 5 [Organization Name]).
- The email must include the following application attachments:
 - Attachment A, Project Scope of Work
 - Attachment B, Budget & Match
 - Signed Declaration page
 - Two (2) Letters of Recommendation, including one from the property owner of the location where the public improvement will take place
 - Current IRS letter verifying the nonprofit organization's 501(c)3 or 501(c)6 tax-exempt status
 - Fiscal Sponsor Letter, if applicable


