

C CONCOURSE EXPANSION

New Year, New Look for C Concourse as Major Changes are Coming



Major construction will kick off on the C Concourse Expansion Project with a new wall to protect the old C1 Building that will span from just outside Checkpoint 4, around and down the center of the C Concourse corridor just past Gate C3. This will create a barrier to allow the project team to open the current building to the elements to get ready to build it up four stories higher.

This project adds additional space and square footage and also opens up more opportunities for Airport Dining and Retail (ADR) space. The Port of Seattle Commission recently approved an RFP in Q1 2024 for 13 new dining and retail spaces for this project. ROADWAY IMPROVEMENTS

Prep Work on Air Cargo Road Underway for Roadway Improvements



As you drive into SEA Airport, you'll notice crews starting work on the hillside near Air Cargo Road to support the Roadway Improvements Project. Next year, construction will begin to relocate Air Cargo Road adjacent to a newly built retaining wall. This is the start of the widening of the roadways that access the Arrivals drive and the Main Garage and will help improve access to parking, the ground transportation center, and curbsides. The goal is to alleviate congestion and reduce queuing on the main roadway entrances for airport visitors and passengers and enhance roadway safety.

Artist in Residence Program Nurtures New Art

A multitude of artists will be commissioning unique new pieces for the C Concourse Expansion (CCE) project. To make this happen, the Port's Public Art Program collaborated with the Pilchuck Glass School and the Museum of Glass to develop a first-of-its-kind Artist in Residence Program. Two CCE artists are participating in residencies at each institution in the years leading up to the building opening. Each residency helps these artists experiment and brainstorm to create their final piece for the CCE. They have completed their program at Pilchuck Glass School and next year they will begin to hone in on a final design for their respective pieces at the Museum of Glass.
