RESTROOM RENOVATION

One Last Door Opens — Restroom Renovation Complete!



The <u>Restroom Renovation</u> project reached its final milestone this summer, opening the last redesigned restroom. The project celebrated with a toilet paper-printed bow!

The final restroom near Gate D1 includes a family restroom, a companion care restroom with adult changing table, a pet relief area, a nursing suite, and even more artwork to add to the airport's public art portfolio. The opening event of this final restroom had appearances from <u>Jett the SEA Otter</u>, SEA Pup <u>Senshi</u>, as well as artists Jen Elek and Jeremy Burt.

This project upgraded restrooms on the B, C, and D concourses. Port project teams and contractor, Bayley Construction, began work in 2018, working to add brand-new facilities and redesign existing facilities. In total, the project increased fixtures for men's restrooms from 58 to 77, women's restrooms from 53 to 67, and family restrooms from 11 to 15. It not only added fixtures, but amenities like water fill stations, adult changing tables, and even the first ever All-Gender Restroom, which opened in 2023.

C CONCOURSE EXPANSION

C Concourse Beginning to Take Shape



The <u>C Concourse Expansion</u> (CCE) hit many milestones this summer! The new building is officially dried in and only has some panels for the building's exterior left to place. The <u>folded façade window wall</u> was installed, along with the glass for the Lookout at C, a platform overlooking the airfield. The photovoltaic array for the roof was delivered and is set to be installed soon. The tower crane finished its heavy lifting and was disassembled in August. 


Next up for the CCE? Project teams and contractor, Turner Construction, aim to finish the exterior paneling, install the solar roof, and then tackle some major interior accomplishments and build outs, including prepping tenant space and installing the wood panels for the Tree at C. All of the tenant spaces are all-electric, just one of the many sustainable features of this new building. This project is stacked with sustainability features and shooting for LEED Gold certification. It's the first major capital project at the airport to apply the Port's Sustainable Evaluation Framework — one of the many ways the Port is working to become the greenest Port in North America.

SEA GATEWAY PROJECT

Alaska Ticketing Lobby Gets a Major Digital Upgrade



Things are looking up on the north end of the Ticketing Level, cosmically! At the far north end in the Alaska

Airlines Ticketing area is a brand-new Alaska check-in space, along with a 60-foot-long digital art piece by Jennifer Steinkamp called "Cosmic." The piece features an array of blossoms and fruit tumbling through space, connecting what can be a chaotic space and grounding it with natural elements and some of Washington's favorite varieties of apples.

This is just another one of many pieces of art getting installed as part of the <u>SEA Gateway Project</u>. More art will be installed on the Bridge and Baggage Claim Levels. Pretty soon, there will be more art than barricades as construction inches even closer to completion.

Still to come this year, the Port's project team, in partnership with Alaska Airlines and contractor Hensel Phelps, is set to re-open a newly redesigned Checkpoint 6 with more space, more lanes, and even more art! An adjacent project also gave Bag Carousel 16 a refresh, with Bag Carousel 15 upgrades in progress, which will open this year, clearing up much needed space on the Baggage Claim Level. ROADWAY IMPROVEMENTS

Roadway Work Continues in Median



The Roadway Improvements project shifted the Departures Drive into its permanent alignment, slightly north along Air Cargo Road, earlier this summer. That created space between Departures and Arrivals drives for crews to demo and regrade the roadway in the median to prepare for two additional lanes. Coming soon, these two lanes will help alleviate congestion, provide dedicated lanes for the parking garage and courtesy vehicles, and reduce idling for private vehicles.
