- Working with Port staff and our Central Procurement Office to identify available opportunities to establish WMDBE goals on upcoming procurements and contracts

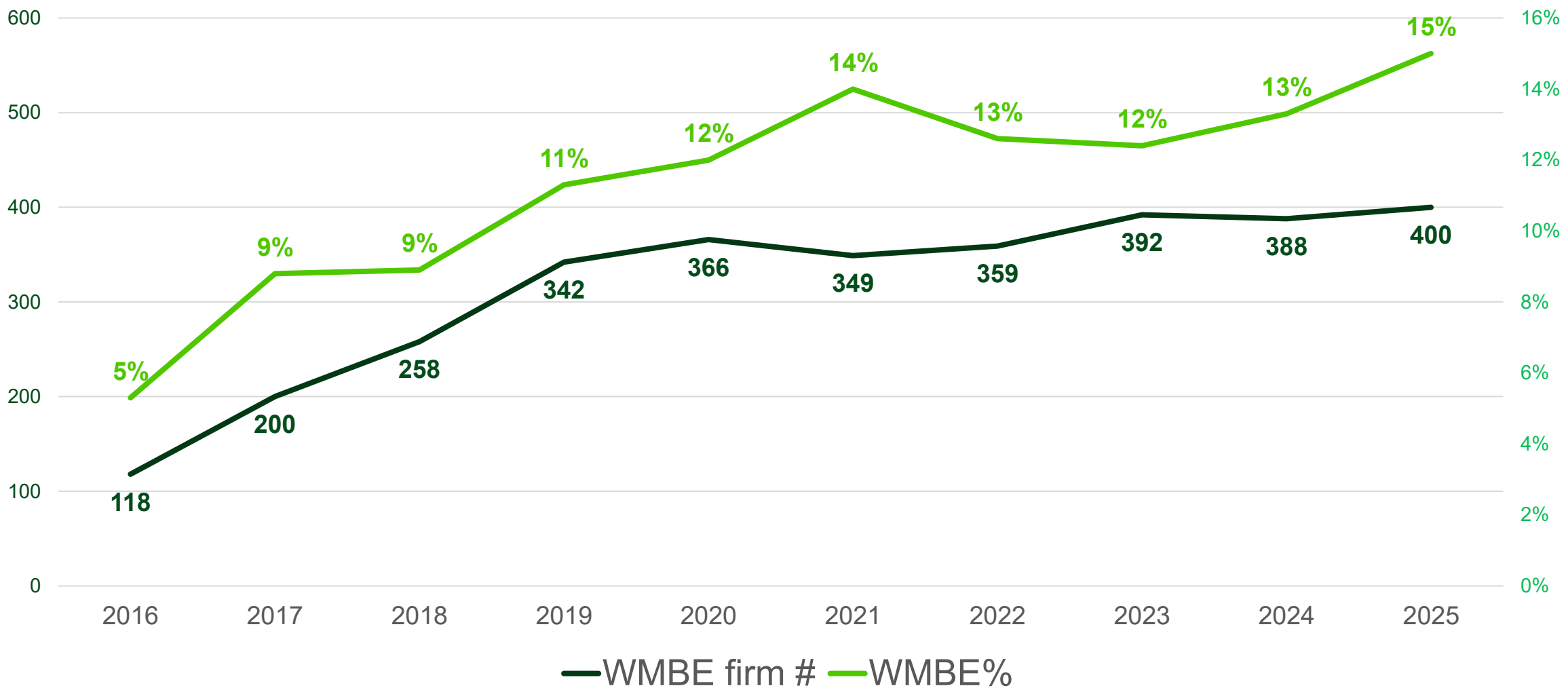
Small Business Objectives/Strategies

The goal of the Port of Seattle is to facilitate competition by small businesses, including DBE & WMBE.

This includes taking all reasonable steps to eliminate obstacles to participation in Port of Seattle contracting opportunities, and to assist in the development of firms so they can compete successfully in the marketplace within or outside the WMDBE Programs.

- Encouraging DBE & WMBEs subcontracting on contracts without a goal rather than Prime self-performing
- Help small businesses better understand Port contracting opportunities
- Limited Public Works contracts
 - Program Launched 2025
- Job Order Contracting (JOC)
 - 90% of work is subcontracted

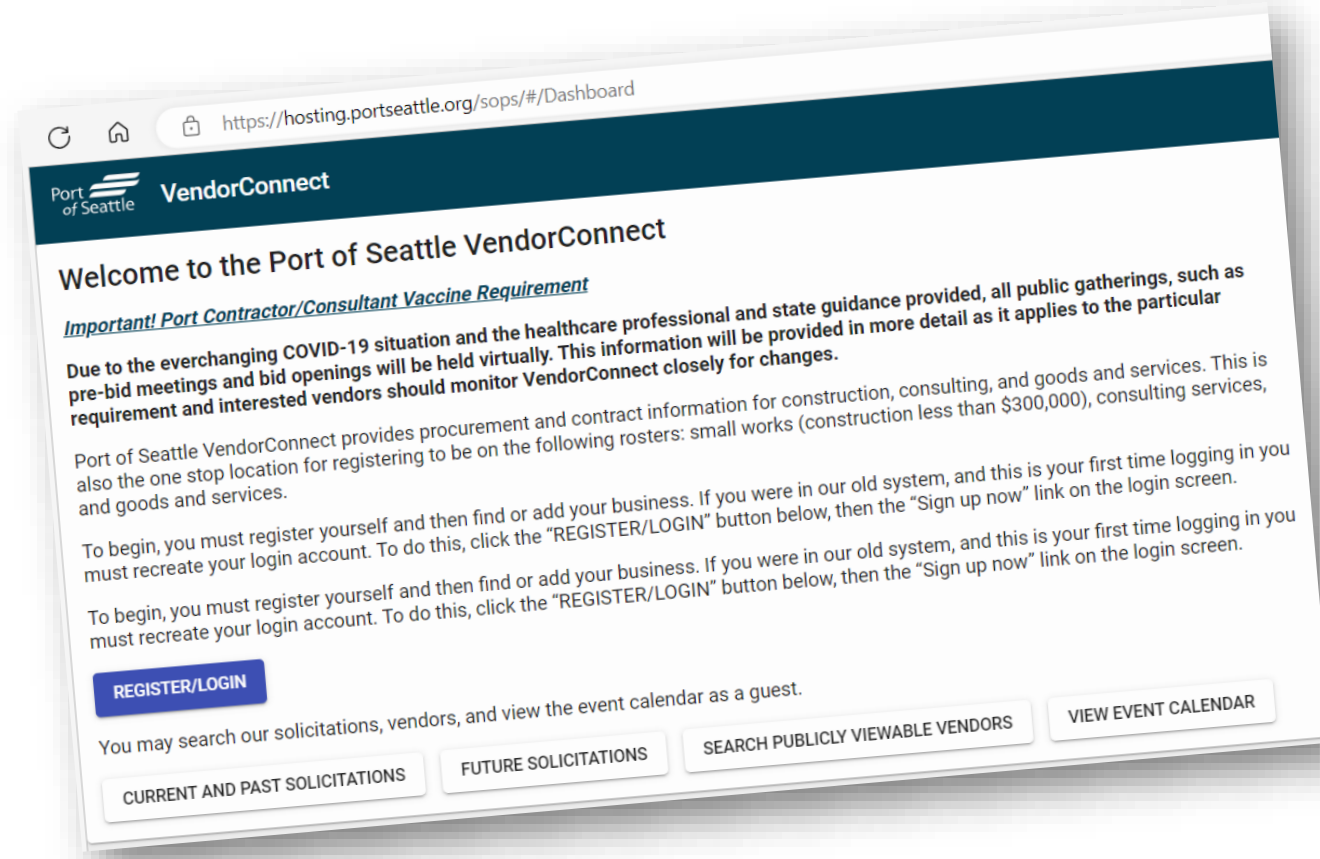

Small Works Roster - Port of Seattle



What you need to register:

1. Valid email address
2. Federal Tax ID # or EIN #
3. UBI #
4. NAICS code

Then, select the Small Works Roster in order to be notified of future construction bid opportunities in the NAICS codes you registered under.

The Port will activate your account within one to two business days.

Direct Contracting Roster - Port of Seattle

Direct Contracting method is an alternative to competitive Small Works process.

Direct Contracting allows to award to an individual contractor on the small works roster and, according to RCW 39.04.152(4)(b), negotiate a price for a public works project that is estimated to cost \$150,000 (without WSST) or less.

Benefits of Direct Contracting

- Reduces the solicitation to award time significantly.
- Allows the Port to work with one Vendor.
- Provides opportunity for project/type work.
- Ideal for large Work Authorizations (\$60,000 – \$150,000)
- Reduces reliance on unit priced contracts.
- Roster rotation can offer opportunities to more than one vendor.

Project Objectives & Overview

Project Objective

To provide 700, 701 and 702 emergency power loads to the main terminal and concourses.

Project Overview

To provide generators and ties from nearby sub stations for emergency power for the Main Terminal, Concourses and Garage.

Estimated Program Cost Range: \$200M - \$350B

Anticipated WMBE/DBE Percentage: TBD

- (2) 2 MW Generators east of the parking garage with pads for 2 more
- Tie ins from the North and South Substations.
- Route, tie in and possibly build rooms out in the concourses.

Components of Interest (Design and Trades)

- Electrical design and build work - inside and out of the Main Terminal, Central Terminal and concourses with extensive temporary systems.
- Civil and structural work - Near the generator site such as grading and shoring a large retaining wall.
- Architectural work - Possible need for rated rooms around the concourses to house electrical equipment.
- Extensive and complex phasing that will require the airport to maintain emergency power at all times.

Learn how to bid on a highway, ferry terminal or facility contract from getting prequalified to submitting your request to bid and learn how to bid electronically using BidX.com.

[Step 1: Prequalify](#)

Learn about the different types of prequalification for public works contracts, find applications and forms, learn about prequalified contractors, and find prequalification laws and rules.

Prequalification

Prequalification ensures that our bidders can do the job!

Work Experience

- Based on completed contracts
- Project owners rate contractors using a form
- Project total is broken out into “classes of work”
- Only work self-performed can be used
- Only work that is standard or above will count (no marginal comments)

Financial Resources

- Yearly updates
- Based on audited or reviewed financial statement
- Net worth is multiplied by a factor based on the number of successfully completed past projects



Small Works Roster

Qualifying for the Small Works Roster **does not** require submittal of a financial statement.



- Limited to projects estimated at **\$350,000** or less
- Only those on the roster receive notice
- A good way for smaller contractors to start doing business with WSDOT
